SHARED VISION

n recent years, the long-established neighborhoods surrounding Visitation Parish and School have enjoyed an influx of residents, including young families.

Developers have invested to the north and east of Visitation with retail shops, restaurants, apartment and condo buildings, the library and grocery store. Additional plans are underway for more commercial and multi-story housing in this area.

With these factors in mind, the parish was proactive in planning for future growth and demand for school enrollment. In 2020, an apartment building on Baltimore Avenue immediately to the north of the school building, was purchased for future development.

A parish- and school-wide assessment in 2021 indicated that the school has potential for a robust future, and enrollment appears to be trending up for the coming school year.

IMAGINING AN EXPANDED & RENOVATED VISITATION SCHOOL CAMPUS

The parish retained Hollis + Miller Architects, a firm exclusively dedicated to education design and the future of learning environments, to develop a Master Plan for the school campus.

After careful review of the Plan and discernment by our various councils and committees, Visitation is looking to parishioners for their thoughts about the proposed campus improvements. Rozanne Prather Consulting, an experienced fundraising and development firm in Kansas City, is leading the parish in a feasibility study to gather this valuable feedback and to determine levels of support if a campaign were launched in the coming 12 months.



o plan for future growth and sustainability of a vibrant Visitation church and school, last year our parishioners were invited to assess our challenges and opportunities. Hollis + Miller Architects responded with a Master Plan that is divided into phases. Please consider the following:

Phase I

An expansive renovation of Visitation School which includes modernized interior finishes, technology
and security upgrades, and updates to major building systems such as electrical, plumbing, window
replacements, roof restoration, and HVAC. This phase will also include improvements to the playground
and parking areas.

Phase II

Construction of a new 3-story school building would accommodate a new Early Childhood Center and several, yet-to-be determined, school grades. The building would be erected on the site of the apartment building immediately north of the school and include a long-awaited kitchen and cafeteria, plus much-needed storage areas.

Total for Phases I & II \$16,928,000

Additionally, a renovation would ensue of the former Kindergarten rooms below the church as a multipurpose center for parish activities. The renovated space may be used for a variety of activities such as
parish retreats and workshops, catechetical, and recreational activities, and meeting areas for parish
groups. The timeline and costs for this project have not yet been determined.

It is anticipated that the above projects can be timed and implemented with minimal disruption to students and will not require relocation during construction.

VISIONARY

IMAGINE A NEW & RENOVATED VISITATION SCHOOL & PARISH ACTIVITY AREA

These features* are among the desired benefits of a new and renovated school and parish activity area.

Visitation School Renovation (Phase 1) and 3-Story Addition including Early Childhood Center (Phase 2):

- Innovative classroom design for student-centered, collaborative, and inquiry-based learning
- Flexible learning spaces for new instructional approaches
- Launch of a year-round fee-based Early Childhood Center (daycarepreschool) to meet demands for quality early learning and to develop a "feeder" system for prospective Visitation School students
- Enhanced courtyard and outdoor learning spaces
- Technology upgrades
- Playground enhancements
- Maker Space
- · Commercial kitchen and cafeteria
- Media center & library upgrades
- New interior finishes: ceilings, walls, flooring, casework and hardware
- LED Lighting + natural light + new electrical system
- High performance, energy-efficient HVAC System
- Secure facilities and play spaces to support safety protocols
- Renovated restrooms
- Energy-efficient windows and blinds for light control
- Roof restoration
- Parking improvements

Renovation of former Kindergarten Classrooms to a serve as a multipurpose activity area below the church (Phase 2):

- Fresh paint
- Updated furnishings
- Welcoming gathering space for parish groups, retreats, workshops, meetings, and catechetical and recreational activities.

GROWING IN COMMUNITY. BUILDING VISITATION.

1911

Visitation Church holds its first Mass on January 1st in a church built at Main and what is now 51st Terrace. The cornerstone for the current church is set in 1915 and dedicated in 1917.

1921

Land is purchased to build Visitation School. Soon after, more land is acquired for the gym and playground. Other school additions are built over the years.

1947

A vibrant Visitation Church and neighborhood growth call for an even larger school. Ground is broken on an 18-classroom Visitation School.

1973

The parish hall, originally added as a chapel in 1953, is remodeled in 1973 and converted to Tighe Hall. In 1974, a complete renovation of the neo-classic church is transformed to 17th Century Spanish style.

2000

Visitation School undergoes renovation and expansion for three classes per grade. To accommodate, Kindergarten classrooms are added in the basement as part of the church and Tighe Hall renovation in 2004.

2004

A major expansion and renovation is completed at Visitation Church. A larger worship area makes it possible for parishioners, who for years worshipped in either Tighe Hall or the Main Church, to now celebrate together.

2006 RECENT CAMPAIGN

Our community generously funded the 2004 renovation with a debt reduction campaign in 2006. A campaign to expand and renovate the school campus would be the first since the most recent effort was completed in 2010.
