## A LITTLE VISITATION

Dear Folks,

Who can explain these things? Somehow, my three siblings, along with an uncle and aunt, have emigrated to Tennessee and Atlanta mostly by way of Missouri and California. That this happened is as puzzling as it was unintentional, but it came to pass nonetheless. By long-standing arrangement, I was gone to visit my family in the Volunteer State during the week after the Supreme Court decision to overturn Roe vs. Wade. Obviously there were priests here that weekend to preside at the Masses. From what I have been told, none of those priests made a particularly developed statement about the Supreme Court decision. If that is true, I certainly bear some sympathy for our priests' decisions not to, uh, *wade* very deeply into the issue. It is a complicated issue, this is a complicated place, and it takes some time to sort out one's thoughts and feelings so that the issue, and this place, are somewhat fairly addressed. I am not at all sure enough time has transpired to do it justice even yet, but the Holy Spirit leads me to venture some remarks. I do not represent the proceeding as a final word about anything. These are just some thoughts I have had in the wake of the Supreme Court's recent decision.



Despite its notorious infamies, the Catholic Church, by virtue of its faith in Christ Jesus, the Holy Scriptures, its historic doctrines, the lives of its saints, and the blood of its martyrs, stands squarely for the inherent dignity of every human life from the moment of conception. Accordingly, the Catholic Church views the intentional killing of any human being as a grave offense against the moral order. Plainly, not every killing is equivalent. The shooting of a threatening intruder is not morally equivalent to the wanton killing of an innocent person walking home from work. Antietam is not equivalent to Auschwitz, although in the mind of the Church both are gravely sinful. The moral culpability attending to every abortion is not equivalent either. An abortion to save the life of a mother is decidedly more worthy of empathy than one performed for, say, the sake of gender selection. But whatever the reason, abortion is an objectively grave matter.

My own pastoral experience convinces me that the objective tragedy of abortion should be a strong concern to society and families. But formidable as the objective tragedy is, the subjective consequences are often even more immediately painful. Abortion not only takes the life of a child, it also often sunders the spirit of a woman who chooses it. My work has caused me to witness much sadness in the last 37 years. It comes in more flavors than Ben and Jerry have names for, but among the most acute and enduring pains people suffer are those rooted in taking human life. I have seen the most sudden agony evinced in the heaving shoulders and tears of dying old men as they confess horrible deeds their natural fear led them to do on battlefields far away. In the same way, I have many times encountered a hopelessness borne of self-loathing that clings to many a wonderful yet wounded woman who had chosen to have an abortion. Oh God, how often I have wanted to reach across a table, and hold them, and try to heal their hearts! It is a breath-taking honor to be a minister of the Gospel and try to bring divine mercy to these sorrowful scenes of deep brokenness.

Abortion is not going away, any more than war will be wiped from the face of the earth, no matter what any judicial or legislative body does or does not do about it. But that does not excuse any of us from working toward a culture of life and love. It has to happen in the pulpit at church and I think I could do a better job of it. Yet even more fundamentally, it has to happen in the home. Abortion, and so many other kinds of physical and emotional disunion, are the ineluctable bad fruits of a value system that believes in human intimacy without consequences. From pornography, to incest, and adultery by the way, when we diminish the respect we owe each other we invite, and even beg, the moral wrecking ball to smash apart what should be most sacred. I pray there can be even more concern for the culture of our homes than for the law of our land. Then something like an epiphany might dawn for everyone.

**What is your name and what is your role in the parish/clinic/school?**

*My name is Beatriz Margarita Borges Gamboa. I am in the religious order of Congregación Apostólicas del*

*Corazón de Jesús (the Apostolic Congregation of the Heart of Jesus). I am the Coordinator of the sponsorship program, one of the projects that belong to the Social Pastoral of María Madre Parish. Currently, the program has 215 children, teenagers, and young people, we accompany 160 families in total. In the pastoral área of the parish, I accompany the liturgical ministry with faith formation in greater depth in order to be aware of what implies the joyful experience of the encounter with Our Lord Jesus Christ, as well as the joy that we experience when sharing the Body and the Word of God.*

**How long have you worked at the parish/clinic/school?**

*I have been working in the parish for two and a half years.*

**In the time you have been employed by parish/clinic/school what is the biggest change you have seen?**

*I have seen the human, Christian and social growth in*

*the people that I accompany in different groups that I participate in. As well, I have seen changes in the formation that the social projects and pastoral have done and the commitment that people show for their community.*

**What is your favorite prayer or quote?**

*As an apostolic we pray two: "As Apostles of the Heart of Jesus" and one of Saint Ignatius of Loyola "Take, Lord, receive all my liberty."*

**Who is your hero?**

*Gandhi, Saint Oscar Romero and Luz Casanova the founder of our congregation.*

**What is your favorite holiday?**

*The Feast of the Sacred Heart and Easter.*

**What are your favorite hobbies?**

*Listening to music, meditation at night, and watching movies.*

**What is the one thing I have learned about myself because of COVID?**

*I have lived the patience, the accompaniment to the people who have suffered and to use online training. Furthermore, I have learned to build a dignified life from the recognition of the human person.*

**My hope for myself and for my country would be?**

*My hope for myself and for my country would be that people become aware of their situation of poverty and inequality and do not get carried away by the assistance that the government gives them for their vote. I pray that they wake up to defend their rights as citizens.*


*School of Religion is a catechetical program that serves the children of Visitation (K - 9 grade), their families and neighbors.*
