PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

The homily series on the Mass begins this weekend. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which guides the celebration of the Mass, allows the Homilist to reflect either on the prescribed Sunday readings or on the Mass itself. As I mentioned last weekend in my Pastor's Corner, I don't choose the second option frequently enough, so for the next five weeks, I will be talking about the Mass itself in the hope of deepening understanding and celebration of it for us all (myself included). This weekend I begin with a general overview and some observations of my own.



The Second Vatican Council highlights the centrality of the Eucharist in our life as a Church:

"Nevertheless the liturgy is the **summit** toward which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time it is the **font** from which all her power flows." Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy #10

That is a classic statement from the Council with profound implications. The liturgy is a font of power, overflowing with strength, wisdom, mercy and beauty. And it is a peak celebration that focuses and directs us as the Body of Christ. Those two nouns, "font" and "summit", are often combined and restated as "Source and Summit." I love thinking of the Mass as a font, a lake, an ocean from which we drink living water. A taste of divine presence brings us a richness that will always engage us, transform us and inspire us. The liturgy is the source and summit of our life as a parish. All our activity is directed toward it. And our power and effectiveness flows from it.

The Council also emphasizes the Presence of Christ in the Eucharist:

"To accomplish so great a work, Christ is always present in his Church, especially in her liturgical celebrations. Christ is present in the sacrifice of the Mass, not only in the person of his minister, 'the same now offering, through the ministry of priests, who formerly offered himself on the cross' but especially under the eucharistic species. By his power he is present in the sacraments, so that when a person baptizes it is really Christ himself who baptizes. He is present in his word, since it is he himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in the Church. He is present, lastly, when the Church prays and sings, for he promised, 'Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.'" Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy #7

The celebration of the liturgy overflows with Christ's presence, within and among the priest and people assembled, alive in the Word proclaimed and incarnate in consecrated bread and wine. We are met with real, eternal, loving presence.

One of my favorite quotes from Vatican II is wonderfully challenging for us all:

"Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people" (1 Peter 2) is their right and duty by reason of their baptism." Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy #14

Because we are baptized, we have the right and duty to participate in the liturgy. None of us are spectators when we gather for Mass. There is no audience, only an Assembly. As members of the Body of Christ, we have the privilege and responsibility to participate fully, consciously and actively. That is an incredibly high standard, and one that elevates our celebration and life of faith. It means that we bring our best selves, our hopes, sufferings, longings, questions and gratitude to our listening, singing, gathering, responding, receiving and going forth.
