PASTORAL CARE



Everyone is, at times, on a difficult journey and needs a caring companion who will listen, empathize and be a reminder of a caring, faith community.

BeFriender program leaders train and support in offering care, a nonjudgmental presence and active listening.

A Listening Presence

BeFrienders receive training on topics such as:

- Grief and loss
- Spirituality
- Listening
- Confidentiality
- Communication

Some questions you may have about BeFriender Ministry:

If my family member has a BeFriender, does that mean I am not meeting his or her needs?

Not at all. A BeFriender cannot take the place of family or friends in someone's life. For many, though, a BeFriender is a supportive visitor beyond the family.

How often will a BeFriender visit?

The frequency is determined by the person visited and the BeFriender. A visit typically takes place every week or two and lasts thirty minutes to an hour.

What if I cannot think of anything to say?

The BeFriender does not come to you to gain information. Rather, he or she will listen and respond, trying to support you at this time in your life, without giving advice or making judgments. And BeFrienders are comfortable with silence.

BeFriender Ministry is not a ministry of "doing," but of "being," - being present and listening quietly.

A LITTLE VISITATION

Dear Friends,

I write this on Wednesday. The weather is humid and warm, kind of like a healing compress after the blast furnace of yesterday. Oddly, I remember so vividly Eileen White Werner, who grew up in this parish, coming through the front door to attend a daily Mass nearly 20 years ago, on a bitter cold morning at Our Lady of Lourdes in Harrisonville. She gingerly stepped into the church, the ice cold wind verily blowing her body into the place. She was shaking the cold out of her, saw me standing in the narthex, and said to me in humor and exasperation, "Why do we live here?" At the time, that struck me as a funny and reasonable question. Almost



always it is too wet, too dry, too hot, or too cold in this place called Missouri. I understand that there are places that get hotter and colder than this one. I know there are places that get wetter and dryer than this one. But I truly wonder if there are many places that get as hot, and as cold, and as wet, and as dry, for as long and as frequently, as this one. Surely some meteorologist out there has a meticulously researched statistical tome to answer this. I will not read it for statistics are seldom interesting, often untrustworthy, and besides, I fear after studying it, I would be even more inclined to rejoin Eileen's wonderment, "Why do we live here?"

Well, this place being the intemperate zone it is, the buildings are under perpetual assault. You folks who dwell in these century old houses know this. I was just visiting with a fellow in the office yesterday about a problem he and I share. As he was leaving, he told me about when he and his wife came to this neighborhood many years ago. He said, "We paid \$60,000 for our house, the county says it is worth north of \$400,000 now. It took me 15 years to pay it off and it has continued to cost me dearly ever since." Of course, the reason his domicile continues to siphon the bucks from his pocket is that the old thing has to withstand the blowing cold and the throbbing inferno of Kansas City. What is more, the parish buildings suffer the same ravaging cycles of torching sun and killing cold, drenching rain and parching drought. And that is why you will notice a large plywood sheet fastened across one of the western apertures of our venerable 1915 church narthex.

Surveying this inevitably obvious plywood, some of you have asked me if/when the church was broken into, what was damaged, what was taken, etc. I am relieved to report that there has been no break-in, nothing has been taken (and one might wonder what they would plausibly take anyway), and everything is fine in there. The doors are being removed, refinished, and rehung because of the terrific beating they take being exposed, as they continually are, to the brutal elements. When Visitation was built, those involved were plainly interested in using the finest materials their money could buy. Consequently, we have very expensive, very beautiful, very heavy, albeit very maintenance-intensive solid oak doors on our church. They must be thoroughly tended every few years and this time they are getting the total treatment; strip to bare wood, sand, sand some more, sand some more after that, stain, sand, varnish, sand, varnish, sand, varnish and sand. That is the process, more or less. I probably left out a sanding or two. The whole job will take between two and three weeks for the west end of the church. Mr. Patrick Casey, a most skilled tradesman, is doing the work. He will come back in the autumn and get the three doors on the south (courtyard), which are in even worse shape than the six west doors. So, there you are. That is the big door story. If any of you still have questions, please send them my way. I am happy to answer them and, besides, such queries are much easier to answer than the human and religious questions I usually get.

I guess I should turn you loose. You are very kind to read these columns. Anymore, coming out as sporadically as they do, I wonder if many people read them. Oh well, my wonderments will have to wait. I hear the familiar voice downstairs of a destitute man who has come again for me to help him. He costs me (not you) a little money, but, on the other hand, I get something too. He is an elderly African-American man and I truly enjoy his stories and idioms. He has a mighty different point of view from the run of us. I suppose that is inevitable, given the very different kind of life he has lived. I enjoy listening to him. I mention this because, far more consequential than doors, it is good to know that the poor can give us even more and more consequentially, than we give them.

FINANCIAL

Contribution Income for June fell short of budget by \$31,136 or 12.4%, as the 2021/2022 fiscal year drew to a close. Other Income, which includes Ministries, Program Fees, Miscellaneous one-time Donations, School Tuition, Registration Fees and Before/After Care Fees lagged behind budget by only \$2,844, bringing our Total Operating Monthly income to a deficit of \$33,980

Parish expenses in June were over budget by \$31,407 bringing our Parish Net Income to negative \$65,387 for the month.

Year -to-Date Contributions and Other Income shows a surplus of \$138,827.

Operating Expenses were over budget by \$171,039 creating a deficit in our YTD Parish Net Income of \$32,212. This year's deficit is attributed to our School Master Plan which was presented to us after the completion of our 21/22 FY budget.

Compared to the prior fiscal year to date, Parish Net Income for 2021/2022 surpassed last year's results by \$166,136.


WHO JOURNEYS THROUGH RCIA?
