YOGA AT VIS

The following yoga classes are being offered for the community at Visitation Parish. All classes are held in the Choir room and are just \$10 each.

Gentle Hatha, Mondays 8:30 am -

In this class we blend breath and movement with an emphasis on alignment. Students build endurance and strength while improving flexibility. We focus on the poses that build the foundation of our yoga practice, learn basic stretches, breathing techniques and proper alignment in a relaxed setting. This class is great for beginners and those who want to move at a gentle pace or work on the foundation poses.

All Levels Flow, Mondays 5:30 pm - This all levels class combines fundamental alignment principles with flowing movement to build balance, strength and focus. Variations can be incorporated for students who are ready and willing to move their bodies with their breath. All levels of experience are welcome!

Vinyasa, Wednesdays 8:30 am - Vinyasa emphasizes flowing movement, incorporating Sun Salutations, breathing techniques and more complex poses. Students improve stamina, strength and flexibility. Variations will be offered. All levels of experience are welcome.


Yin/Restorative, 8:30 am Thursday, March 30 Thursday, April 13 Thursday, April 27

Yin/Restorative class will be 75 minutes long, and will have fewer poses that are held longer. This class will focus on the connective tissues, increasing circulation in the joints and improving flexibility, while releasing tension in the mind and body. We will use props to support our bodies while we hold each pose for 3 - 7 minutes, helping to deepen the stretch while relaxing the mind. We will have more time to transition between poses because we will be using several props. Most people find this style of class very relaxing and beneficial to their mind and body.

Just Faith Series Offering Again this Spring Tuesday evenings, April 18-June 13 from 6:30 - 8:45 pm


For the sixth time in the last two years, RJC will offer the 8-session program called Faith and Racial Healing: Embracing Truth, Justice and Restoration (written by JustFaith Ministries) in which a small group will pray together, read books, watch videos and have conversations around how we can seek racial justice in our community. We hope that 8-12 people will join Karen Miller and Peg

Ekerdt as they facilitate this series. Five previous groups of Vis parishioners have found this Just Faith experience to be a process that invites deep listening and mutual respect. We invite you to join this session—THINK ABOUT IT PLEASE.

Cristo Rey Interns Continue to Thrive

Nancy Hesse reported that our four Cristo Rey interns are doing well; teachers value the work of the interns, the students look forward to the presence of the interns in the classroom. In a unique situation, one of the interns tutored a 7th Grader in math for a short time and that seemed to work well (even though the plan was to have interns work with younger students. Julio (senior) and Ashley (junior) have been at Visitation for two years; this is the first year for Andrea (freshman) and Carla (sophomore). Teachers are continuing to learn how to make the most of having the interns with them. We hope to continue this program for 2023-2024. With \$11,000 in the bank, we have work to do to raise the \$30,000 that will make it possible to maintain the presence of four interns in the school. FINANCIAL

February Contribution Income exceeded budget by \$25,132, as parishioners faithfully fulfilled their outstanding 2022 pledges and new pledges for 2023. This surplus aligns with the financial patterns seen in previous years. This month's excess in contributions reduced the year-to-date shortfall in contribution income to \$35,615 or 1.1% of budget.

Other Income, which includes ministries, program fees, miscellaneous one-time donations, school tuition, registration fees and before/after care fees exceeded budget by \$1,689 in February.

Parish Expenses, however, were over budget by \$31,282, largely as a result of higher utilities and ice and snow removal costs incurred during the winter weather in February. This cost overrun offset the positive variance in Operating Income, leaving Parish Net Income under budget by only \$4,461 for the month.

The positive variance in February Contributions reduced the negative variance of year-to-date contribution income to \$35,615, while Other Income exceeded budget for the year-to-date by \$38,847. This further offset the negative variance in Contributions resulting in Total Parish Operating Income of \$3,231. Parish Operating Expenses for the year-to-date, however, exceeded budget by \$5,268, or 0.01%, driven primarily by a variety of unbudgeted facility and maintenance expenditures in both Church and School. Adding these expense overages to the contribution excess produced a negative variance in Parish Net Income of only \$2,036 for the year-to-date. Please note that Extraordinary Income, which includes Capital Improvement Fund donations, memorials, wills and bequests are not reflected in our normal operating results, but have generated a surplus of over \$333,258 so far this year which will offset the negative variance in Net Operating Income for the fiscal year.


