

FINANCIAL

March Contribution Income exceeded the budget by \$12,571 or 4.7%. This month's excess in contributions have reduced the year-to-date shortfall in contribution income to \$23,044 or 0.7% of budget.

Other Income, which includes Ministries, Program Fees, Miscellaneous one-time donations, School Tuition, Registration Fees and Before/After Care Fees exceeded the budget by \$1,689, due largely to the increase in the interest rate paid on our funds on deposit with the Diocese.

Parish expenses, however, were over budget by \$28,487, largely as a result of higher utilities and ice and snow removal costs incurred during the winter weather in February. This cost overrun offset the positive variance in Operating Income, leaving Parish Net Income under budget by \$13,709 for the month.

The positive variance in March Contributions reduced the negative

variance in year-to-date contribution income to \$23,044 or 0.7%, while Other Income exceeded budget for the year-to-date by \$41,054. This further offset the negative variance in Contributions and left Total Parish Operating Income at \$18,009 over budget. Parish Operating Expenses for the year-to-date, however, exceeded budget by \$33,755, or 0.9%, driven primarily by higher than anticipated utilities and a variety of unbudgeted facility and maintenance expenditures in both church and school. Adding these expense overages to the contribution excess produced a negative variance in Parish Net Income of only \$15,745 for year-to-date. Please note that Extraordinary Income, which includes Capital Improvement Fund donations, memorials, wills and bequests are not reflected in our normal operating results, and have generated a surplus of over \$303,264 so far this year which will offset the negative variance in Net Operating Income for the fiscal year.

- 1. What is your name and what is your role at the parish/clinic/school?
- 2. How long have you worked at the parish/clinic/school?

My name is Wendy Torres. I am 32 years old and I have been working at Maria Madre Parish since 2012. I have had many different positions. I was in charge of the water filter project for Maria Madre for four years. I coordinated the open school project for four years, and I was member of the Formation and Catechesis team and the Pastoral Council of parish. Now I am the clinic coordinator or manager. So far, I have worked at the parish for 9 years.

3. In the time you have been employed by parish/clinic/school what is the biggest change you have seen?

I grew up in this neighborhood, which is one of the most violent in San Salvador, with many social and economic problems. I have been a parishioner since I was 10 years old. To me, Maria Madre parish has been like an oasis in the middle of the desert, a light in darkness for many vulnerable families, including mine. My brother and I were members of the scholarship program. As a worker one of my biggest change was to get awareness about the social problems, and the importance of the historical memory of the country. I have been learning a lot about the root of social problems and the most important from people and their own life experience, from their struggles and hopes.

4. My favorite prayer or quote?

I have many! "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (this is very hard to practice.) "The LORD is my shepherd, I lack nothing." Psalm 23 (this phrase gives me calm when I feel very overwhelmed.) "What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, and yet lose or forfeit their very self?" Luke 9:25.

5. Who is your hero?

My hero is Jesus, his Gospel is revolutionary and the love of God is revolutionary. Also, I feel very inspired by the women of the community specifically the mothers that lose their children because of violence and yet they keep their faith and trust in God.

6. What is your favorite holiday?

My favorite holiday is Christmas Eve. It is the time we renew hope and we share with family. It is also a time to expect good things for next year! In addition, we eat delicious food.

7. What are your favorite hobbies?

My favorite hobbies are eating and traveling.

8. What is the one thing I have learned about myself because of COVID?

As coordinator of the clinic, I had to work during the whole pandemic. It was a personal choice, of course. I was scared and threatened by the virus, but I knew I have to work for others (many people came to the clinic with the hope we would attend to them) and my family. In this order, I learned about my strength as a human, but also I was sure God is whom is walking with us no matter how bad the situation is.

9. What is your hope for yourself and your country?

My hope for myself and for my country would be, in this moment in the country where weird situations are happening my hope would be justice and peace even when we are far away of it.
