
#### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners,

It is wonderful to be here at Visitation! The faith, hospitality and energy of this parish community have

overwhelmed me already, and it's still only summertime! Thank you for welcoming me into the Vis family, and thank you for the promise of so much good to come!

Some of you know I grew up in Southeast Kansas City in St. Matthew's Parish. I am the fifth of six children, 5 boys and 1 girl, and we are all a year apart. My father was a meat cutter at Safeway, and my mom was the parish secretary at St. Matthew's. I grew up around the church, my siblings and I attended St. Matthew Apostle School, and I even ended up working at St. Matthew's when I was in high school and college, mowing grass, vacuuming floors, cleaning bathrooms and changing light bulbs.



I graduated from grade school in 1977 and went on to O'Hara High School. I graduated in 1981 and went to Rockhurst College, where I first studied Computer Science, then moved to Accounting, then on to Marketing, all in the span of two years. I finally realized that none of those were my niche. What I really loved Theology and Philosophy. Combined with my love of parish life and the arrival of a wonderful pastor at St. Matthew's who made diocesan priesthood come to life for me, I decided to transfer to Conception Seminary College as a Junior in 1983. I graduated two years later and went on to Mundelein Seminary in the northwest suburbs of Chicago.

The formation at Mundelein was wonderfully geared toward forming priests for parish ministry, and I'm grateful for those years. I'm also grateful that I felt the freedom at Mundelein to express some doubts about the priesthood. I left in the middle of my final year, realizing that I just needed more time to discern. I stayed in Chicago for a few months but quickly realized I needed and wanted to be back in Missouri near my support system. I moved to the Newman Center at Missouri Western State College in St. Joseph, where a friend was Chaplain. I got a job selling suits and Dillard's and over the course of a couple of years, felt a continued call back to the seminary.

I returned to Mundelein in the fall of 1992, had a wonderful year there and was ordained in 1993. I have served as Associate Pastor of both St. Elizabeth and Visitation. My first pastorate was at Our Lady of Guadalupe in St. Joseph, followed by Good Shepherd in Smithville. I moved to St. Elizabeth as pastor in 2013, and after ten years there, was named pastor of Visitation!

I have been richly blessed these last thirty years as a priest to serve in wonderful parish communities, surrounded by so many amazing and dedicated people of faith. I look forward to many years ahead here at Visitation. Thank you for letting me join you on this journey!







#### **RACIAL JUSTICE**



#### **RACIAL JUSTICE**



Missouri's First Black-owned Brewery Is Opening in Kansas City's Jazz Neighborhood — Just in Time for Summer. Vine Street Brewing will join the less than 1 percent of Black-owned breweries in the U.S. By Evie Carrick.

Just as certain states dominate the craft beer industry — think Vermont and Maine, which have the most breweries per capita — so do certain people. According to a 2021 survey conducted by the Brewers Association, which represents small and independent craft brewers in the U.S., 93.5 percent of the craft brewery owners surveyed were white and 75.6 percent were male.

With this obvious imbalance in the beer industry, it's no surprise that the opening of <u>Vine Street Brewing</u> in Kansas City, Missouri, is making such a splash. The new brewery, which opens on June 30, is the state's first Black-owned brewery and will join the less than 1 percent of <u>Black-owned breweries</u> in the U.S. "Beer is an African invention, so when we begin to peel back the layers of what we all thought we knew about beer, we're left with an amazing space to share its diverse history and create new memories," Kemet Coleman, who is opening the brewery with co-owners Woodie Bonds Jr. and Elliott Ivory, told *Travel + Leisure*. "We believe that being Black-owned expands the culture of beer by offering a fresh perspective and experience that is often underrepresented in the beer industry. We hope our brewery can inspire other Black-owned businesses and encourage the beer industry to embrace diversity and inclusivity."

The Vine Street Brewing owners are determined to create a vibe that's unlike what you'd find at a typical brewery. The brewhouse is <u>located in Kansas City's</u> 18th and Vine neighborhood, which has been internationally recognized as the <u>center of jazz music</u> for decades. To honor the history of their location, the owners (two of whom have musical backgrounds) will make music a main focus — with listening parties, beat battles, and live music in their outdoor beer garden and adjoining green space.

Even the beer will be inspired by the musical history of the owners and the neighborhood. "Our mission is to craft ales and lagers fermented in the spirit of jazz and hip-hop, so rhythm and improvisation are core values of our brewing and brand identity," Coleman said.

While waiting to open its doors, Vine Street released its debut brew: a black lager called Jazzman. Coleman said, "It's ironic that a black lager is our debut in the Kansas City beer scene, but we didn't plan that." So far, fans are on board and the beer has seen a lot of demand in both Kansas and Missouri.

The brewery is housed in a 150-year-old structure that was the city's first public works building. The limestone structure had been neglected for decades and was <u>covered in graffiti</u> — a piece of the building's history that the brewery owners opted to keep. The original arched windows let plenty of light into the brewery's two taprooms and an outdoor beer garden offers outdoor seating that runs adjacent to almost two acres of green space.

Although the brewery will not be serving food – at least not yet – the refurbished building has other tenants, including The Spot, a cafe and grocery store run by chef Shanita McAfee-Bryant.

In everything they do, there's one constant you can expect from the team at Vine Street: "Our brewery is designed to celebrate the rich cultural heritage of Kansas City and uplift the voices of our community," Coleman said. "Our space is designed to bring together people of different backgrounds and experiences, fostering a sense of community and belonging."
