PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

I grew up having a dog in the house, and I've always enjoyed it. There were the dachshunds: Duchess and Sam. There was Patches the beagle. There were the hunting dogs: Duke, Cookie and Jake. One of the things I was excited about when I became a pastor and got a house to myself was the opportunity to get a dog of my own. Knowing the dachshund breed and enjoying their spirit, I got a black and tan dachshund named Truman. He was rescued from a puppy mill and was four or five years old when I got him. He was pretty emaciated and unfamiliar with the outside world, so I was happy to give him a good home. He quickly gained some needed weight and developed a strong affinity for rawhide and squeaky toys. Truman loved everyone and was sure everyone loved him. He was quite the hunter of rabbits, mice and anything else that moved and especially loved to go fishing with my dad. He was a great companion and brought me a lot of joy. Truman died at age 15 or 16 in 2009 after living with diabetes for a year. I still miss him!



I got Remi in January of 2010, another rescue dog recently freed from a puppy mill. Remi was also a dachshund, though his coat was black, white and tan. He was a beautiful dog but had been caged and mistreated for 5 years. He had never been socialized so he had some behavioral issues that took some work and adjustment. Remi was another wonderful companion for me and brought a lot of joy and humor to my life. He was very different from Truman, who loved to be outside walking, hunting or fishing. Remi wanted nothing to do with the outdoors and much preferred the couch, which in some ways made him much easier to take care of! Where Truman was an athlete, Remi was a professional napper. He really attached himself to me and trusted no one else. I always said

that Remi's universe was pretty small: I was the sun and he was the only planet. Remi was healthy for most of his life but died after a brief illness in 2021 at the ripe old age of 16. I miss him a lot too!

I have thought about getting another dog, but am going to wait for a while just to get a sense of life at Visitation. Having a dog as a single person is challenging, as the care, feeding and presence are all up to me and given the demands of parish ministry, I need to be prepared for the impact a dog will have on my life and schedule. I want to be sure I can manage it before I get another one. It will happen sometime in the future, I'm pretty sure, but the "when" is a big and important question. In the mean time, I'll just savor the memories that Truman and Remi have left me.

Monday Evening Classes

School of Religion is a catechetical program that serves the children of Visitation Catholic Community and their households. We meet on Monday evenings from 5:15 – 6:15 pm at Visitation Church. Every week opens with a 15 minute, kid-friendly prayer service followed by classes for K–8th graders. We use a lectionary-based curriculum that includes age-appropriate lessons from the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Each enrolled child also gets their own catechism booklet to take home at the end of the year.

Celebrating the Sacraments

On the first Monday of the month we celebrate God's Word with the reception of Holy Communion. During Advent and Lent, the sacrament of God's Mercy (Confession) is offered during the S.O.R. "Holy Hour." We also offer a sacramental preparation class for second and third graders who are ready for their First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.

First Mondays after class, parish households enjoy fellowship at monthly Family Dinners. Other family-friendly events throughout the year have included Advent Stations, Care Kit service projects, Christmas caroling, Stations of the Cross during Lent, a Church Treasure Hunt and May Crowning of Mary. These are perfect opportunities to invite older siblings, grandparents, godparents and neighbors into the life of your domestic church.


Our medical delegation will be leaving on September 30 and will be carrying over the counter medicine to assist the health clinic. Donations of the following medications and items will be appreciated:
