

RACIAL JUSTICE



The parish Racial Justice Committee met on August 23. Here is a review of Summer Activities:

- June showing of *Aftershock* (a film about black women maternal health available on HULU) that was led by Katie Levi and prompted good attendance and discussion;
- a July book discussion of *How to Fight Racism* by Jemar Tisby—the 20 people in attendance engaged in a meaningful conversation led by Clare Bond and Linda Hughes; and the
- August meeting with **Councilwoman Melissa Robinson** at the last session of our summer Just Faith Racial Healing group and alumni.

New Business:

- School faculty member, Nancy Hesse reported that Visitation School again will have four Cristo Rey student interns. Ashley, a senior, will return to Vis for her third year with us. In addition, we'll have a junior, a sophomore, and a freshman. The interns will work with the Kindergarten classes as well as some Specials classes.
- The results of our May survey of Vis School faculty prompted a discussion about ways to collaborate with the school be that through speakers, field trips or special events during November's Black Catholic History month.
- Just Faith Update: This summer we offered the sixth 8-week series of Just Faith's Racial Healing program. The group was small but equally moved and informed by what we read and discussed. This summer group included two members of our partnering group from St. Monica Parish, Angela Curry and Alvin Brooks.
- What comes next? Another book discussion and possible books were discussed; a renewed emphasis on supporting Black-owned businesses; developing a plan for quarterly offerings -
