

Our sponsor family has been experiencing so many new things in the past six weeks. They are eager to learn and are making great adjustments on a daily basis. As a team we are in awe of their courage and open hearts. In addition to providing transportation to Samuel Rodgers Health Clinic for several health appointments, our team has helped the family with things that so many of us take for granted: introducing the world of trash pick-ups and recycling, running a thermostat and microwave - and most importantly, getting their oldest child, 6-year-old Mauridi, started in kindergarten.

We attended Back to School night at Martin Luther King Elementary with Mauridi and his mom, Francoise, on August 17. The kindergarten teachers and school staff were so welcoming and helpful. They showed him his classroom and locker and despite not understanding English, the big smile on Mauridi's face showed his excitement. He also was fascinated watching the



kids that were on the athletic fields practicing soccer and football. He definitely was dreaming about his future out there on the field!

Our team helped the family navigate the school bus system, location of the bus stop and pick up and drop off times. He is a brave little boy! His grandfather, Awaya, was a secondary school teacher in Africa for 42 years, and we know this family values education. We hope that his younger brother, Lukando, will be enrolled in pre-school, although Della Lamb folks caution that may take time. We recently learned his 17-year-old aunt, Marie, would like to attend high school. The team at Della Lamb is working with the family to achieve those goals.

We have taken the family to Mass at St. James Mid-town where they have found a few members of the parish who speak French and Swahili. We look forward to bringing the family to Mass here at Visitation on hospitality Sunday.
