

FINANCIAL

Once again, our contribution budget for the new fiscal year is based on the 3-year average model. As last year's actual contribution income did not meet budget projections, the average this year increased only by .09% to \$4,175,984. With regard to the parish expense budget, this year's projections are higher than last year to account for the current inflation rate. They include salary increases for all staff members at both the church and school. Ultimately, we were able to submit a balanced budget to the Diocese of \$5.37 million for the 2023/2024 fiscal year.

August 2023 Contribution Income fell short of budget by \$6,857 or 2.62%. Other Income, which includes Ministries, Program Fees, Miscellaneous one-time Donations, School Tuition, Registration Fees and Before/After Care Fees exceed budget by \$2,656 in August. Bringing our Total Operative Monthly income to a deficit of only \$4,201.

Year-to-date Contribution and other Income exceeded budget by \$10,769. Operating Expenses were over budget by \$33,461 creating a Net negative variance in our YTD Parish Net Income of \$22,692.

Compared to the prior fiscal year-to-date, Parish Contribution Income for 2023/2024 surpassed last year's results by \$50,745 while Other Income came short by \$225,004, creating a Total Operating Income shortfall of \$174,299. Parish Expenses were higher than last year by \$92,970 for a net difference \$267,268.

RACIAL JUSTICE



Approximately 65 individuals gathered on September 14 for the latest Continuing the Conversation on Racism and Our Faith session in Tighe Hall, hosted by Kansas City Catholics Addressing Racism (KCCAR). In addition to parishioners from St. Monica and Visitation, attendees joined from St. Francis Xavier, St. Elizabeth, St. Thomas More, St. Therese Little Flower, St. James, Holy Family, Missionaries of the Precious Blood, Our Lady & St. Rose and Redemptorist.

Jerry Pullen and Steve Miller recapped KCCAR's June meeting with Bishop Johnston, noting his responses to our questions, as well as agreed upon next steps. Participants heard from National Black Catholic Congress attendees and viewed a powerful film, *Answering the Call to Thrive: The Legacy of the Black Catholic Congress*. Table discussions centered on the gifts of Black Catholics to the broader church and the perseverance demonstrated by Black Catholics (see questions below). Alvin Brooks closed the evening in song, leading participants in a shared singing of "Sometimes I Feel Like a Motherless Child."

The next Continuing the Conversation event will take place in January at St. Monica, date TBD. Also, please look for an article in the October-November edition of *The Catholic Key on KCCAR's inception and ongoing work.*

- 1. Inspired by Blessed Thea Bowman, several people on the video referred to the "gifts" of Black Catholics to the church...that Black Catholic churches are "not a problem to be solved, but gifts to be shared." Name some of these gifts you have personally witnessed/received. Which ones are especially important for today's church and the future church?
- 2. Archbishop Wilton Gregory speaks of Black Catholics "clinging to their faith" through pain. And several people on the video mentioned the centuries of long-suffering for Black Catholics caused by people within and outside of the church. What impact can this "spiritual memory" have on the American Church in particular?
- 3. Gloria Purvis said in the video about the church, "her teachings are true, even if her followers" do not adhere to them. How have you been able to personally overcome this contradiction and "keep the faith"?
- 4. One person on the video remarked that the church shouldn't just "acknowledge" Black Catholics, but "celebrate" the Black Catholic tradition. How does such "celebration" manifest in the church's educational, social and liturgical ministries?
