Has the diocese approved this service?

FINANCIAL

December Contribution Income exceeded budget by \$168,465 or 29.67%, as a result of timing differences in the giving patterns of our parishioners. Other Income, which includes ministries, program fees, miscellaneous one-time donations, school tuition, registration fees and before/after care fees, lagged behind budget by \$29,833 due to grant funds not being received in the month budgeted, bringing our Total Operating Monthly income to a budget surplus to \$138,632.

Parish expenses in December were over budget by \$29,233. This was fueled primarily by higher than anticipated facility expenses. The combined effects of the items discussed above generated a Parish Net budget surplus of \$109,409 for the month of December.

Overall, the same conditions are reflected in the year-to-date financial results. Contribution Income has exceed budget by \$150,121, or 7.8%. Other income is ahead of budget by 2.49% or \$21,710, leaving an Operating Income Budget surplus of

\$171,831. Operating Expenses for the year-to-date, fueled by the December negative variance above, as well as the overrun in November, now exceed budget by \$121,118, or 4.5%, generating a parish net operating budget surplus of \$50,713.

Compared to the prior fiscal year-to-date, Parish Contribution Income for 2023/2024 surpassed last year's results by \$175,192, while other income was short by \$184,010 creating a Total Operating Income shortfall of \$12,279. It should be noted that the difference in other income, is because PTO contributed all the excess money in their account received from previous years in 2022. Parish Expenses were higher than last year by 5.56% or \$147,703 for a net budget shortfall of \$159,982.


