THE SEASON OF LENT

- Pray ~ Our St. Joseph and Blessed Sacrament chapels, and our church nave are open during the day for personal prayer. On Mondays, they remain open until 6:30 pm for parish children and their families. After the weekday 8:15 am Mass, the Rosary is prayed in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. On Wednesday, there is Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the St. Joseph Chapel from 9:00 am - 1:00 pm. Catholics are encouraged to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for Easter. Our Parish Communal Penance Service is Wednesday, March 20 at 6:00 pm.
- # Fast and abstain ~ Persons between the ages of 18 and 59 are asked to keep a simple fast (one full meal plus two smaller meals that together do not equal one full meal and no snacking) on Good Friday. Persons over the age of 14 are asked to abstain from eating meat on all Fridays of Lent.
- # Give Alms ~ Opportunities for generosity include: Rice Bowl (benefits Catholic Relief Services) throughout the season; Catholic Relief Services Collection (overseas emergency aid) on the March 9-10 weekend; and the Good Friday Collection on March 29 (benefits Christians in the Holy Land).



ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

It seemed to be more than a coincidence that my first Saint Vincent de Paul case, after a long hiatus, was an Irish Catholic woman who grew up in my father's parish! I shared with her my family name and found out that she was in the sixth grade class with an uncle that I never knew. He lived to the age of 11 after a diagnosis of leukemia. She shared memories of carrying a statue of Mary in the service they had for him and visiting at my dad's childhood home. Honestly, my dad and his siblings didn't really talk much about my uncle. Perhaps it was more than chance that I was one of the SVDP members sent to meet with her.

This woman was asking for a small amount of money for her rent. She was not only a victim of a predatory loan but also a scam that allowed someone to steal her social security funds from the prepaid debit card program. She recognized that she had made her own mistakes with her spending. Luckily, she was able to make a connection with our St Vincent de Paul conference at Visitation. We were able to help her with \$279 towards her February rent bill so that she could get a handle on her situation. She expressed her gratitude for the fellowship and the assistance. I expressed gratitude for sharing stories of my uncle and family. This is why I chose to be part of St. Vincent de Paul. To me this is an example of community! *- Shannon Condon*

Taking Miracles Seriously: A Journey into Everyday Spirituality by Michael Zedek


Why we love this book:




