

# FIRST EUCHARIST RETREAT

In preparation for their First Eucharist, our second graders participated in a retreat dedicated to this significant sacrament. Guided by teachers, faculty members, parishioners, and parent volunteers, the students dedicated part of their school day to deepen their understanding of the Eucharist's importance. Organized into groups, they engaged in various activities including Jesus-themed yoga, crafting crosses, participating in a foot-washing ritual, baking unleavened bread for communion, musical sessions, exploring the sacristy with Mrs. Kallman, listening to stories, and taking a tour of the church. Let's keep these children in our prayers as they continue their journey towards their First Holy Communion later this month.













## HECTOR OLIVERA PERFORMS...

Our third-grade students were treated to a special exploration of organ music as they had the privilege of experiencing a performance by acclaimed organist Hector Olivera on our beautiful parish organ.

#### **FINANCIAL**

March Contribution Income exceeded budget by \$68,323 or 24.67%, as a result of timing differences in the giving patterns of our parishioners.

Other Income, which includes ministries, program fees, miscellaneous one-time donations, school tuition, registration fees and before/after care fees, surpassed budget by \$20,741 primarily due to tuition timing, bringing our Total Operating Monthly income to a budget surplus to \$89,064.

Parish expenses in March were over budget by \$37,300. This was fueled primarily by higher than anticipated facility expenses and personnel benefits. The combined effects of the items discussed above generated a Parish Net budget surplus of \$51,764 for the month of March.

Overall, the same conditions are reflected in the year-to-date financial results.

Contribution Income has exceed budget by \$231,652, or 6.7%. Other income is ahead of budget by 8.53% or \$90,276, leaving an

Operating Income Budget surplus of \$321,928. Operating Expenses for the year-to-date, fueled by the March negative variance above, as well as the overrun in February, now exceed budget by \$213,508, or 5.3%, generating a parish net operating budget surplus of \$108,420.

Compared to the prior fiscal year-to-date, Parish Contribution Income for 2023-2024 surpassed last year's results by \$239,380, while other income was short by \$475,117 creating a Total Operating Income shortfall of \$235,737. It should be noted that the difference in other income, is because PTO contributed all the excess money in their account received from previous years in 2022. Parish Expenses were higher than last year by \$219,467 for a net budget shortfall of \$455,204.



This website features a directory of local resources and also six online educational programs on basic topics like lifestyle, food, energy, transportation, clothing and your own yard.
- Diocese of Kansas City-St Joseph is in the process of putting together a 1-year environmental plan to promote the integral ecology espoused by Pope Francis and to facilitate specific activities that lessen the carbon footprint of our lives.



JOIN THE PARISH RACIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE ON TUESDAY, APRIL 30 AT 7:00 PM in Tighe Hall for a discussion of <u>Kingdom Quarterback</u>: <u>Patrick Mahomes</u>, the Kansas City Chiefs, and How a Once Swingin' Cow Town Chased the Ultimate Comeback, written by KC-area natives Mark Dent and Rustin Dodd.



The book describes the history of Kansas City and the history of the Kansas City Chiefs in alternating chapters—eventually telling the story of Patrick Mahomes, his arrival in the city and what that means to the Chiefs and to the city.

Some part of the story are familiar: Patrick Mahomes has led a team to win three Super Bowls and competed in another, and has helped turn the Kansas City Chiefs from famed playoff failures into Super Bowl champions, all the while winning the hearts of the city with his on and off the field presence.

The book also explores how the city's urban development created lovely neighborhoods that largely left out people of color. It's been a long road attempting to move past the scars of segregation and overcome the city's flyover reputation, but the authors help tell the story of a city poised to have a national impact. Start your reading now, or attend without reading

the book; the discussion promises to be rich either way.




