PRAYER VIGIL FOR DAVID HOSIER TUESDAY, JUNE 11 AT 5:30 PM

On Tuesday, June 11, the State of Missouri plans to execute David Russell Hosier for the murder of Angela Gilpin. The execution is troubling for many reasons. Of course, our catechism provides that the death penalty is "inadmissible" as a punishment. David's case presents the issue of the execution of a man who is far more than the worst thing he ever did. He is a Navy veteran and former EMT and firefighter, and poses no threat to the prison population if he spends the rest of his life there.

The execution is scheduled for 6:00 pm. Our vigil will begin at 5:30 pm in the St. Joseph Chapel with prayers and scripture, and end with a rosary for those who are able to stay. If you are not able to attend the vigil, please pray at that time for David, his family, Angela Gilpin and her family, David's legal team, the state's legal team and the prison workers who must inflict this death.

Dear Parishioners,






