

#### **RACIAL JUSTICE**

#### **CRISTO REY INTERNS**

Visitation's Racial Justice Committee began a collaborative initiative in 2021 that has allowed the parish and school to work together in order to bring four Cristo Rey High School students to work as interns at Visitation School. Over 117 parishioners have made contributions (\$9,000 per student this coming year) to make this happen.


Each year we review the initiative. To date, all who are involved - parish and school leaders, involved faculty, donor parents and the committee who initiated this collaboration (VIS RJC) - support the continuation of the Cristo Rey intern program at Visitation School.



As we have contacted past donors to thank them for their support, we continue to hear good things, including this statement from parishioners Ty and Mandy Ketchum:

A Catholic education has been such a meaningful part of our children's faith-filled lives, and we are thrilled to support the Cristo Rey students in not only their Catholic educations but also in their career interests in education. The partnership between the students of Cristo Rey and Visitation is a powerful one that benefits the entire community.

We are grateful for the support of so many parishioners - school parents as well as many from the larger parish community - and look forward to another successful year.



The Racial Justice Committee will host a discussion on <u>Facing</u> <u>Georgetown's History: A Reader on Slavery, Memory and Reconcilation</u>, edited by Adam Rothman and Elsa Barrazza Mendoza, on **Tuesday, June 10 at 7:00 pm** in the Retreat Room. RJC members David Bruegging and Linda Hughes will lead the discussion of this collection of essays. Past Just Faith participants and all parishioners will have the opportunity to learn a more full version of the Catholic church's complicity with slavery, and the reconciliation process planned and implemented by Georgetown Jesuit leaders. Facilitators will also provide an update on the reconciliation process at Georgetown.

**The Quilters** - streaming on Netflix - less than 1 hour.

The Quilters follows the daily lives of several quilters inside the sewing room at South Central Correctional Center, a Level 5 maximum-security prison in a small town two hours south of St. Louis, MO. From design to completion, the men reveal their struggles, triumphs and sense of pride in creating something beautiful in this windowless, sacred space deep within the prison walls. Most of the men are serving sentences from 20 years to life. It's an excellent film. #### **FINANCIAL**

#### **CONTRIBUTION INCOME**

In April, Contribution Income surpassed budget expectations by \$20,133 or 9.24%. This surplus was primarily caused by timing differences in parishioner giving patterns.

#### **OTHER INCOME**

Other Income, which includes ministries, program fees, one-time donations, school tuition, registration fees and before/after-care fees - was under budget by \$19,450. The primary reason was a timing difference in our FIRE allocation that is expected to be received at a later date.

#### **OPERATING INCOME**

The combination of these variances resulted in a total Operating Income surplus of \$6,437 for April.

#### **PARISH EXPENSES**

Parish expenses were over budget by \$11,147, due to payroll timing and the addition of a new part-time maintenance employee at the school.

#### **OVERALL APRIL NET**

The parish's overall net budget for April reflected a shortfall of \$4,710.

#### YEAR-TO-DATE (YTD) FINANCIAL SUMMARY

#### **CONTRIBUTION AND OTHER INCOME:**

Contribution Income is ahead of budget by \$171,283 (4.3%). Other Incomes behind budget expectations by \$103,05. Together, the differences result in an Operating Income Budget surplus of \$61,160 for the year-to-date.

#### **OPERATING EXPENSES:**

Operating expenses are over budget by \$150,074 (3.0%):

- Diocesan ACA \$74,641
- Personnel salaries and benefits \$37,881
- Facility expenses \$9,590
- Prayer and Worship \$12,349

This leads to a Parish Net Operating Budget shortfall of \$88,914.

#### COMPARISON TO PRIOR FISCAL YEAR:

Parish Contribution Income to date for FY 2024/2025 is \$215,515 higher than the same period last year. Other Income fell behind last year's results by \$324,001 due to timing of the PTO contribution. This has resulted in a Total Operating Income shortfall of \$108,486. Parish Expenses are \$479,479 higher than last year.

#### LAUDATO SI WEEK- MAY 24-31

Ten years after Pope Francis' Encyclical Letter was introduced, we reflect on the powerful messages he shared and the work still to be done to care for our common home. Below are some excerpts from this body of work. To learn more or to get involved in the Laudato Si movement, go to www.laudatosimovement.org.

22. These problems are closely linked to a throwaway culture which affects the excluded just as it quickly reduces things to rubbish. To cite one example, most of the paper we produce is thrown away and not recycled.



- 25. Climate change is a global problem with grave implications: environmental, social, economic, political and for the distributions of goods. It represents one of the principal challenges facing humanity in our day. Its worst impact will probably be felt by developing countries in the coming decades.
- 28. Fresh drinking water is an issue of primary importance, since it is indispensable for human life and for supporting terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems.
- 53. Never have we so hurt and mistreated our common home as we have in the last two hundred years. Yet we are called to be instruments of God our Father, so that our planet might be what he desired when he created it and correspond with his plan for peace, beauty and fullness.
- 68. This responsibility for God's earth means that human beings, endowed with intelligence, must respect the laws of nature and the delicate equilibria existing between the creatures of this world, for "he commanded and they were created; he established them for ever and ever; he fixed their bound and he set a law which cannot pass away." PS 148:5b-6.




