The Visitation Refugee Assistance Committee is continuing to assist our two refugee families as they get their large families established in Kansas City. Our current focuses include assisting both families with applying for Green Cards, providing transportation to medical appointments and English classes and advising them with any and all unexpected challenges that come up, especially in these uncertain times. A recent addition to our family of refugees is a single Congolese mom, named Asende. She and her children arrived in the US a few years ago, and originally settled in Michigan, but moved to Kansas City in late 2024 for a job opportunity. On June 1, she and her five children, ages 4-14, moved into a two bedroom apartment just east of downtown - and they are so happy to have a place of their own. We would love to help her furnish the apartment, so we are asking our generous community for help once again. IN SOLIDARITY WITH MADRE, VISITATION'S SISTER PARISH

Visitation celebrates Madre Month each July. The parish has the opportunity to learn more about Santa Marie Madre de Los Pobres, a small, poor parish in San Salvador, the capital of El Salvador. The Madre parishioners are proud of their country and heritage. Unfortunately, the country is impoverished and dependent upon funds sent back from immigrants in the United States. These funds are in danger because of the severe imprisonment of Salvadorans at the hand of their government under the guise of stopping gangs. The impoverishment continues with the deportation of Salvadorans from the United States and incarceration in the maximum security prison. Madre citizens face more economic devastation because their family members and deported immigrants are imprisoned without due process.
