PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioner,

We are definitely in the season of giving. As I said last week in my homily, there is a lot being asked of us all these days. Our Shared VISION Campaign, since early summer, has invited every one of us to pledge our support for the future of Visitation School. We will replace the old HVAC with a new system, create a more secure and protective front entry, remodel the front lobby area, replace windows with higher resistance glass, renovate all classrooms and bathrooms, update the interior courtyard and add a Maker Space to promote 21st century project-based learning. As one of the core ministries of our parish, our school is one of the significant ways we follow Jesus' command to teach and make disciples. I'm grateful to all who have made a pledge and invite everyone to do the same. As of this writing, we are just under \$10,000,000 pledged!



We continue our diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal and pledge our support to diocesan ministries, so many of which animate and provide direction to parish ministries. If you have yet to pledge to the ACA, please consider doing so. We are about 35% of the way to our goal. Our parish Annual Appeal is now kicking off as well. This is our week-in week-out pledge to put our treasure to work for the mission of Visitation Parish. Your offertory pledge pays the bills to maintain, heat and cool our facility, to have the lights on, to pay myself and our parish and school staffs to direct and oversee our ministries, to provide hospitality and care for the suffering and needy who come our way, to communicate, to clean and so much more. 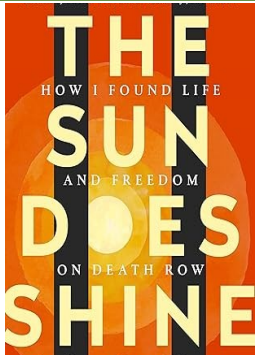

RACIAL JUSTICE BOOK DISCUSSION

NOVEMBER 18 AT 7:00 PM

Join Jan Fakoury and Mary Gigliotti as they lead a discussion of *The Sun Does Shine: How I Found Life and Freedom on Death Row* on Tuesday, November 18 at 7:00 pm in the Faith Formation Room in Tighe Hall. Reading the book is welcome, but not required.



The Catholic Church sets aside the month of November to honor the history of Black Catholics in our country. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is the primary source for the information in this bulletin. Although these men and women are on the road to sainthood in the Catholic Church, it is also true that they experienced exclusion and discrimination throughout their lives from within and outside the Catholic community.

Venerable Pierre Toussaint, (1766-1853) a philanthropist and founder of many Catholic charitable works, was born a slave in Haiti and brought from Haiti to New York as an apprentice under a popular hairstylist in the city. He eventually became the most sought-after hairdresser of high society women. Upon the death of his master, he gained his freedom and quickly succeeded as one of the country's first black entrepreneurs. He became quite wealthy, but instead of spending lavishly on himself, he supported the Church and the poor. He and his wife sheltered orphans, refugees and others in their home. He founded one of New York's first orphanages and raised money for the city's first cathedral. During yellow fever epidemics, Toussaint would risk his life to help others by nursing the sick and praying with the dying. *"I have never felt I am a slave to any man or woman but I am a servant of Almighty God who made us all. When one of his children is in need, I am glad to be His slave."* For more information on Venerable

Venerable Mother Mary Elizabeth Lange (1784-1882)

Servant of God Mother Mary Lange was born Elizabeth Lange, a native of the Caribbean, and believed to be Cuban born of Haitian descent. She was the foundress and first Superior General of the Oblate Sisters of Providence (1829-1832), the first religious congregation of African American women in the history of the Catholic Church. On July 2, 1829, Elizabeth and three other women professed their vows and became the Oblate Sisters of Providence with the goal of educating and evangelizing African Americans. They educated youth and provided a home for orphans. Freed slaves were educated and at times admitted into the congregation. They nursed the terminally ill during the cholera epidemic of 1832, sheltered the elderly, and served as domestics at St. Mary's Seminary. Mother Mary Lange practiced faith to an extraordinary degree. It was her deep faith – in close union with Jesus – which enabled her to persevere against all odds. She lived through disappointment and opposition until God called her home in 1882. For more information on Venerable Lange's cause, check out the website:

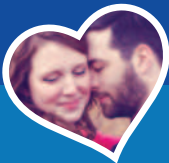
