Dear Parishioners,





RACIAL JUSTICE

The Catholic Church sets aside the month of November to honor the history of Black Catholics in our country. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is the primary source for the information in this bulletin. Although these men and women are on the road to sainthood in the Catholic Church, it is also true that they experienced exclusion and discrimination throughout their lives from within and outside the Catholic community.



Servant of God Sr. Thea Bowman, FSPA (1937-1990)



Sr. Thea Bowman, FSPA was the only child born to middle-aged parents, Dr. Theon Bowman, a physician, and Mary Esther Bowman, a teacher. At birth, she was given the name Bertha Elizabeth Bowman. She was born in 1937 and reared in Canton, Mississippi. As a child, she converted to Catholicism through the inspiration of the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration and the Missionary Servants of the Most Holy Trinity who were her teachers and pastors at Holy Child Jesus Church and School in

Canton. During her short lifetime, many people considered her undeniably close to God as she lovingly invited others to encounter the presence of God in their lives. She is acclaimed as a "holy woman" in the hearts of those who knew and loved her and continue to seek her intercession for guidance and healing. Servant of God Friar Martin de Porres Maria Ward (1928-1999)

Friar Martin de Porres passed away on June 22, 1999, at the age of 81. He had dedicated 51 years of his life to the Conventual Franciscan Friars, much of which was spent in Andrelândia, Brazil. Friar Martin became the first African American Conventual Franciscan in North America. Shortly after his ordination to the priesthood on June 4, 1955, he volunteered for missions in Brazil. He was well-known in his religious community and among the people he served for his cheerful, charitable and humble demeanor. He dedicated himself to the people of Andrelândia, particularly the poor. On Saturday, November 1, seven Visitation parishioners attended the Becoming Beloved Community's third annual Racial Justice Summit. Keynote speaker Reverend Dr. William Lamar IV spoke of giving voice to the voiceless, noting that erasure of people's perspectives is always a pretext to violence. He urged congregants to rage against the erasure and animosity of our world, and called for a holy rage against the false gods of America – greed, racism, misogyny, etc. Break-out sessions led participants in understanding a range of topics, including challenging political conversations, immigration, literacy, economic justice, reparations, housing and workers rights. October Contribution Income showed a

registration fees, aftercare fees – exceeded budget by \$41,888. This favorable variance was driven primarily by a one-time donation to the school and the receipt of Bright Futures payments for the MO Scholars enrolled at the school. As a result, Total Operating Income reflected a budget surplus of \$80,780 for the month.

Parish Expenses in October were over budget by \$39,856, primarily due to personnel costs (a three-week pay period) and increased Facilities expenses. The combined impact of these factors resulted in a Parish Net Budget Surplus of \$40,924 for the month.

Extraordinary Income for the month of October was over budget by \$103,986, primarily due to donations received for the Shared VISion Capital Campaign. There were no Extraordinary Expenses, bringing the Net Parish Surplus to \$144,910.

Even with the rebound presented in October, year-to-date (YTD)

Contribution Income remains below budget by \$29,936 (2.8%). Other Income T is ahead of budget by \$231,059 (64.9%), resulting in an Operating Income budget surplus of \$201,123.

Operating Expenses for the YTD are over budget by \$106,401 (5.2%), resulting in a Parish Net Operating budget surplus of \$94,722.

Extraordinary Income is over budget by \$894,196, of which \$892,986 is donations to the Shared VISion Capital Campaign. Extraordinary Expenses total \$52,792 for the fiscal year-to-date.

Prior Year Comparison – Compared to the same period in fiscal year 2024–2025, Contribution Income for 2025–2026 is lower by \$18,733, while Other Income is higher by \$435,395, resulting in a Total Operating Income surplus of \$416,622. Parish Expenses are higher than last year by \$189,225, producing an overall YTD budget surplus of \$227,397


