We have an exciting year ahead. Our Shared VIStion project is moving forward with great momentum. With over 50% of the project budget collected and over 75% of the project budget pledged, we have met the diocesan requirements for a capital campaign and have received approval from the bishop and the Diocesan Building Commission to move forward. As so many parishioners continue to honor and even exceed pledges to the campaign, we are so grateful and excited about next steps!



The next few months will see more significant progress for the project, with the bidding process now in full swing and plans for construction taking shape. Under the expert guidance of Newkirk Novak Construction Partners and Hollis + Miller Architects, our Shared VIStion for Visitation School is going to become reality in 2026! The full renovation of the school will happen this summer. Construction on the Maker Space will commence subsequently, giving us a state-of-the-art space and facility for 21st Century learning, one that we hope to share with other area schools. This year will stand as a transformative one in the history of our parish.

We will also continue to gather for Sunday Mass, serve the grieving, the sick and those in need, deepen our knowledge and practice of our faith, take care of our facilities and strengthen the bonds of our community. As we live the mission entrusted to us in 2026, we will praise and thank God and give a home to the Word Made Flesh.

RACIAL JUSTICE



The Visitation Racial Justice Committee met in person in early December. The meeting provided opportunity for discussion of what has succeeded and what we might do differently in the coming year.

- Thank you to Mandy Ketchum and Kristin Kratofil for orchestrating the adoption of a family at Operation Breakthrough for Christmas.
- Just Faith has offered two 8-week series this year: Faith and Racial Healing: Embracing Truth, Justice and Restoration and Faith and Racial Justice: Changing Systems and Structures. Participants in each series brought new energy to the program. Just Faith has raised awareness of every participant in the past four years. RJC wishes to continue to offer these series—winter/spring and late summer/fall.
- A Just Faith reunion proposed for those who have participated in the past 9 sessions. Invite all to re-read a chapter of *Post Traumatic Slave Syndrome* or *Color of Compromise* and then JF alumni meet to discuss. JoAnn Axtell agreed to lead this effort.
- RJC has hosted multiple book discussions in the past two years. Participant levels have varied, but value was seen in raising awareness and increasing involvement, potentially with other parishes. Discussion continues—all suggestions are welcome and encouraged.
- The Equal Justice Initiative daily emails and print calendar were discussed as good options to stay rooted in racial justice issues. <https://calendar.eji.org/about>.
- RJC will again co-sponsor the dramatic reading of Dr. King's Letter from the Birmingham Jail. School students will be invited to greet and to be part of the **January 19** event.



JANUARY IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS MONTH.

SO WHAT EXACTLY IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING? AND WHAT CAN I DO TO HELP?

Good questions! Human Trafficking covers a LOT and first you need to be aware that it is happening in the US, even in our area. Every year, millions of men, women and children are lured by force, fraud or coercion to work as slaves or perform commercial sex acts. Any community is vulnerable and victims can be any age, race, gender or nationality. To build your awareness, go to www.dhs.gov/bluecampaign for more background. You can find out how to avoid buying products made with forced labor, and get ideas to help with this problem by checking out the US Catholic Sisters website: www.alliancetoendhumantrafficking.org. It's easy to raise awareness if you wear blue on January 11 and make social posts to spread the word. You can also join us in Tighe Hall on January 11 after 8:00 am Mass to help label soap which will in turn be taken to local motels. Let's free the victims and end Human Trafficking.



YOUR HELP IS NEEDED TO LABEL SOAP FOR THE SOAP PROJECT!

All ages and abilities are welcome. Please join us in Tighe Hall after 8:00 am Mass on Sunday, January 11 to label soap and learn about the good work being done to combat Human Trafficking by the Soap Project. The SOAP Project Outreach is a unique, hands-on opportunity that allows groups of any size to fight human trafficking locally and potentially recover victims. Human trafficking has been reported in both poverty-stricken urban area motels as well as in suburban upscale hotels. With that in mind, we aim to educate those working in these locations on the signs of trafficking, arm them with the resources to fight it, and give victims a way out. But to do this, we need your help.

COMING SOON: BIBLE STUDY FOR YOUNG ADULTS






