RACIAL JUSTICE

THE VISITATION RACIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE RJC MET IN PERSON ON JANUARY 28.

THESE ARE MEETING HIGHLIGHTS:

- Evaluation of the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. prayer service on January 19: The readers were excellent and powerful, the music was exceptional and moving, the crowd was sizeable, the presence of our Visitation School students (and some parents) was greatly appreciated. Next year we will consult football playoff schedule before setting a time for this event. But this event will continue. It felt this year like a call to action.
- **Cristo Rey Update** *We have two CR Interns this year, both working in the school. Nancy Hesse is the school faculty advisor for them both. Teachers in the primary grades are able to utilize the skills and assistance that each intern brings. VIS RJC, who is the sponsoring organization for this collaboration, has embraced a second semester project to meet occasionally with our interns—to bring lunch—and make a more personal contact.
- RJC again sponsored a **Just Faith 9-week** series this past fall. Participant Kristin Kratofil reported on a visit the group made to Journey to New life and offered ways in which RJC could support JNL: creating Hygiene bags, attending the annual (April 23) fundraiser, serving as a pen pal to the incarcerated and sharing life skills.
- After discussion of the value of RJC book discussions, the group will offer a discussion of *James* by Percival Everett on March 24 at 7:00 pm. Mandy Ketchum and Kristin Kratofil will lead the discussion.


