

THE SEASON OF LENT

- ‡ **Pray** ~ Our St. Joseph and Blessed Sacrament chapels, and our church nave are open during the day for personal prayer. On Mondays, they remain open until 6:30 pm for parish children and their families. After the weekday 8:15 am Mass, the Rosary is prayed in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. On Wednesday, there is Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the St. Joseph Chapel from 9:00 am - 6:00 pm.
- ‡ **Fast and abstain** ~ Persons between the ages of 18 and 59 are asked to keep a simple fast (one full meal plus two smaller meals that together do not equal one full meal and no snacking) on Good Friday. Persons over the age of 14 are asked to abstain from eating meat on all Fridays of Lent.
- ‡ **Give Alms** ~ Opportunities for generosity include: Rice Bowl (benefits Catholic Relief Services) throughout the season; Catholic Relief Services Collection (overseas emergency aid) on the March 14-15 weekend; and the Good Friday Collection on April 3 (benefits Christians in the Holy Land).

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

If you've ever attended 3:00 pm Mass here on Christmas Eve, you know how full the church gets. It's wonderful to see the church overflowing with family, friends and visitors, all here to celebrate the Eucharist for the Feast of Christmas. You also might know that accommodating the large crowd and providing as much seating as possible is a challenge. To that end we are going to pilot a new approach to liturgies with large crowds this Easter Sunday at 10:30 am Mass.



First, we are going to train a group of ushers who will provide more direction to all who assemble for Mass. These ushers will identify areas where seating is available and direct people to sit there. In the past, we have allowed people to save seats. And while that serves a purpose, it becomes difficult for us to manage seating for such a large crowd. So we will allow saving of seats on Easter Sunday until 10:15 am. After that, ushers will ask people to move together to make room and begin seating in any open areas. I'm asking you in advance to cooperate with this. I will announce the same at 10:15 am on Easter Sunday.

Along with this, I advise you to arrive before 10:15 am if you want a seat. Given the large attendance, the pews will fill up well before the scheduled start of Mass. We do our best to have adequate overflow seating in the Gallery and Narthex, but even these fill up well before Mass begins. You might consider attending the 8:00 am Mass as an alternative. And when people are seated in the Narthex, we want to assure a prayerful liturgical experience for them, so if you do pass through the Narthex before or during Mass, please show respect for those seated there as it is liturgical space. Leaving early and especially taking photographs or visiting with others in the Narthex while Mass continues truly disrupts the prayerful experience of the liturgy for those seated there.

As I said above, we will pilot this on Easter Sunday with the hope of developing it for the future. No doubt we will learn some things from it this first year. I ask you to be cooperative and respectful as we seek to improve our celebration of these significant liturgical celebrations.

RACIAL JUSTICE





Small Lenten Groups offer a dedicated time each week during the Season of Lent to share in lively conversation as we reflect on the week's readings in an intimate group setting.






