# **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners,

As the homily series on the Mass concludes this weekend, we move to the Communion Rite. It begins with the Lord's Prayer in which we join our voices to pray for the coming of God's kingdom, and to ask God to provide for our needs, forgive our sins and bring us to the joy of heaven. The Rite of Peace follows. We pray that the peace of Christ will fill our hearts, our families, our Church, our communities and our world. With hope, we extend a sign of peace to those near us.

In the Fraction Rite, the consecrated bread is broken as we sing the Lamb of God. The action of breaking the bread recalls the action of Jesus at the Last Supper when he broke the bread before giving it to his disciples. It reflects our own call to self-sacrifice as his followers.

Before receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, we pray "Lord I am not worthy..." The celebrant receives, distributes to the Extraordinary Ministers, then the rest of the Assembly come forward in procession. As we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we say "Amen" as a sign of our Communion with Christ and one another. As the Communion Song is sung, the unity of voices echoes the unity the Eucharist brings.

Following the Communion procession, we spend time in silent prayer of thanksgiving. There's a special quality to communal silence, especially among a people who have been fed the Bread of Life. The Communion Rite ends with the Prayer after Communion which asks that the benefits of the Eucharist remain active in our daily lives.

There is time for brief announcements, highlighting how the Mass nourishes the mission entrusted to us. The celebrant then initiates the dialogue with the assembly, "The Lord be with you," offers the final blessing and dismisses the people with one of four options. "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life" calls us to put the Eucharist into action. A song of sending reinforces our mission in faith as the Body of Christ and sends us joyfully forth.

The source and summit of our faith, Mass invites fully conscious and active participation and draws us deeper into the mystery of God with us.



- Those baptized as a Catholic who have not yet celebrated the Sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation


