RACIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE



This school year we welcomed four high school scholars from Cristo Rey Kansas City to serve as teacher aides for our kindergarten through second grade students at our school. Now, roughly two months into our school year, we are thrilled to report on the positive impact this program is having on both these Cristo Rey students and on our Visitation community.

This program benefits all involved in three important ways:

1) These four Cristo Rey work-study scholars, who have expressed interest in a career in education, benefit from real-life classroom experience and from the mentorship of our amazing Visitation School faculty.

2) With the help of our Cristo Rey scholars, our Visitation teachers can focus more time on the critical educational aspects of their job and less time on activities like grading papers. Our Vis teachers also leverage the Cristo Rey teacher aides to provide students with additional assistance in critical areas like reading.

As one of our teachers reports: *“Three of the Cristo Rey interns, Rosemary, Ashli and Jeoli come in my room at the beginning of every morning. They check student morning work, answer questions and help students who don't understand something about their assignment. I also have them work one on one with students, reinforcing different skills. Since they have been overseeing morning work, I have had more time to pull together small groups of students to read with them and work on different skills. I am able to spend time in small groups with more students each day than I have been in the past.”*

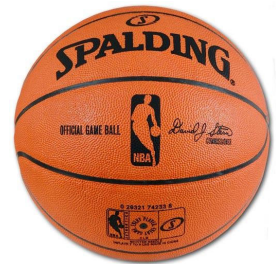

FINANCIAL

Contribution Income in September fell short of budget by \$18,200 or 7.6 % reducing our accumulated positive variance through August and bringing the year-to-date surplus in contributions to \$1,083 or 0.14%. This downturn is rooted in timing differences in the giving patterns of donors during the current calendar year.

We are still hopeful that these (and all of our) parishioners will show their heartfelt generosity and fulfill their 2021 pledges by the end of December in order to bring our Contribution Income for the year-to-date into alignment with our budget in the next few months.

Other Income, which includes ministries and program fees, miscellaneous one-time donations, school tuition, registration fees and after care fees fell short of budget by \$4,771 in September, in large part due to rebates not received on time and timing of religious education registrations. School tuition and registration fees are on budget.

Parish expenses were over budget for September by \$12,542, due to school personnel, facilities and operational expenses. The net before extraordinary for the month of September shows a deficit of \$35,513. Taking into account the positive variance in Parish Income generated during the past couple of months and the expense underruns for the year to date, Parish Net Income over performed expectations by \$14,207, or 6.5%.

Compared to the prior fiscal year to date, Parish Net Income for 2021/2022 surpassed last year's results by \$63,353, or 27.23%. This particular positive variance, however, will fluctuate from month-to-month as the year progresses, due in part to normal contribution and expenditure timing differences and to the volatility and some uncertainty that the Covid pandemic has introduced into Visitation Parish life.
