A LITTLE VISITATION

Dear Beloved of Christ,

I have sometimes wondered what it must have been like for Mary Magdalene, the “Apostle to the Apostles,” to be walking in her grief to the grave of Jesus on that first Easter Sunday morning. The gospels tell us she had some tokens of piety and remembrance in her hands, spices to apply and oil to pour. Her tender mind would have been so tossed with turbulent waves of wonder. She would have been so deep into digesting the strange experience of knowing the mysterious Jesus, witnessing his words and works, feeling his love, and watching him die a tortured and ignominious death. Then to come upon the tomb and find it open would have been startling and heart-wrenching. No doubt she wondered for a moment if she was even in the right place. Maybe in her anxious and emotional state she had somehow become lost. So she “ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple whom Jesus loved and told them, ‘They have taken the Lord and I don’t know where they put him.’” She must have felt, at that point, that she had not only lost Jesus on the Cross, now she had lost him again, from the tomb. Everything, every vestige of this man she loved was ripped away from her. How cruel can fate become? She does not even have the consolation of an unwelcome answer. She does not know what is going on. She knows she feels asunder and expects the worst. She can only survey the bleak situation and blink, and cry.



So John and Peter came and surveyed the situation. They saw the empty tomb and “went back home” we are told in John 20:10. But Mary Magdalene stayed around there. Her devotion was rooted in a love so deep. She could not be torn away. And her perseverance was greatly rewarded when after briefly talking with two men at the tomb she turned around and her eyes caught the gaze of a man who asked her, “Woman, why are you crying? Are you looking for someone?” She thought he was a gardener and said, “If you have taken him away, please tell me where and I will get him out of your way.” And that man she had taken for a cemetery tender simply said to her, “Mary!” and she then somehow understood. Her mind cleared and her heart flooded with deep and ecstatic love. She would not find Jesus among the dead, the object of her errand would go wanting, because he was in fact alive. Jesus told her to make the trip to see the boys once again. She was to tell them that he was alive and “ascending to my God and your God.”

As she ran back to Peter and John for the second time that morning, how surreal it must have been. She surely wondered if she had dreamed the whole thing, yet she ran relentlessly to complete the critical mission Christ had specially entrusted to her. And later, when some of the fog had cleared and the impossible was recognized as actual, I have it in my head that she repeatedly said to herself, “I shouldn’t have wondered. . . . I shouldn’t have wondered. . . . I was there when he fed the multitudes. . . . I was there when he restored the sick. . . . I heard his provocative words. . . . I witnessed how he commanded that band of fractious followers. . . . I saw how he confounded the best minds of the religious authorities. Why have I been so obtuse? I love him as much as anyone could love him and even I have been slow to believe that there is more to this life of ours than meets the eye. Why have I been so convinced that what I perceive as the limits of possibility constitutes the fullness of truth? . . . I have put my world, my life, and my God, in a box, wrapped it up with a rational bow, and wrote “truth” on it and now, from what I saw today at the tomb, I know I had no right to do that. . . . I should not have wondered.”

In my gut, I think that every one of us will experience a moment like this. Yes, even me, a glass half empty, severely skeptical kind of guy. I know I am blessed in many ways, but some days I have a good bit of trouble assessing the portents of my blessings. But for all my debilities, life has gathered to me an intuition that Mary Magdalene’s excellent adventure will be replicated in all of us. We will be so surprised to learn that Easter is real.

On August 2, 2018, the Vatican announced that it had formally changed the official Catechism of the Catholic Church on the death penalty, calling capital punishment “an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person” and deeming it “inadmissible” in all cases.


