



#### **RACIAL JUSTICE**



Just Faith Racial Healing is an eight-week program that fosters active listening, dialogue and prayer as a small group explores and deepens awareness of the history of privilege and racism.

The current Just Faith group, the ninth such group that our parish Racial Justice committee has facilitated, is nearing completion. True to the experiences of the past 90+ participants, this group has formed a bond of support, and deepened their understanding of the challenges of racism. The final sessions will include a session on the true theology of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr and participation in Johnson County Library's Dividing Line tour. On May 7, Terri E. Barnes, president of the

Nia Project and member of the Mayor's Task Force on Reparations will be the speaker for the final class. All past Just Faith participants are invited to attend the May 7 session.

We are humbled by the commitment of this Just Faith group, which includes Vis parishioners, parishioners from other parishes, as well as diocesan Vicar General, Fr. Charles Rowe and the Director of the Office of Life and Justice, Deb Sheppard. It is a privilege to share the journey with all of this group.

The parish Racial Justice Committee will continue to offer the Just Faith Racial Healing in the months to come.
