A LITTLE VISITATION

Hello Friends,

This weekend is Pentecost. When we did the Video Visitation earlier this day I meant to encourage you to wear red to Mass this weekend in honor of the Holy Spirit. The Producer, Megan Burdolski, even reminded me to do this, but I forgot just the same. I hope the crimson tide will be evident anyway because I think most all of us enjoy it. I remember my first Pentecost here when I noticed the room full of red. It lifted my spirits and bespoke an uncommon liturgical attention in our parish. I guess I had better blow the dust off my own red Mass vestments. They are worn of a weekend so seldom that even after 36 years they are sort of stiff and newish compared to their mates of the other liturgical colors.

Dr. Dave Ekerdt has very graciously accepted my invitation to speak about our Visitation Parish Synod process results this weekend. Dave is a longtime professional educator, so he knows how to present material in a cogent and even entertaining way that is not burdened by undue length. I think his message to us is important because it affords us a chance to listen to what each other is saying/thinking about the Church. The whole purpose of the Synod process, as discerned and announced by Pope Francis, is to get the Catholic Church listening and talking to itself, root and branches, not just episcopal conferences and the Vatican. Our Church is so unaccustomed to effectively speaking and listening to itself that the prospect of trying to do it mystifies a good number of us. In too many respects, we have grown to thinking of "Church" as "it" rather than "us." We habitually think of the Church as an organism that exists independently of us, not so unlike Microsoft or McDonalds. In fact, the Church is you and me. We belong to the Catholic Church and the Catholic Church belongs to us. Indeed, it is not a democracy. How could anything so large and far-flung effectively be a functioning democracy? But its polity needs to be flattened some, and rearticulated, in order to breathe new relevance and devotion into our holy Christian life. I think there are enough signs to conclude that Pope Benedict XVI understood this. Pope Francis certainly understands it. Hence the Synod process. Hence Dave's important report to us today. And, of course, I realize that the Synod process is a small step on a long road. But one has to begin someplace. One must crawl before he walks, and walk before she runs.

I has been a very interesting couple of years around here. Like nearly every parish, we have been forced to dance whole new numbers in response to the pandemic. The pandemic has been a challenge, no matter how one chooses to assess it, but it has also been a sort of backhanded blessing because it has focused and forwarded some of the consequential movements confronting the Christian community. Mass attendance, school enrollment, the character of our work, and relative emotional stability have variously been effected by the tides of contemporary society, compressed through the complications of COVID. In the name of prudence and duty, we have to respond to these things. Accordingly, my mind is fairly swimming with thoughts that need a good bit more mental distillation before I share them with you. For now, I only want to acknowledge that we live in a time of accelerated change in the world, and even in the Church. I do not believe anyone can say how it will turn out except that it will be surprising to everyone in some ways. And, that it will take a lot of time for us to better align our ethics with our technology and our venerable, durable faith with the rapidly evolving exigencies of modern life. Yet Christian faith and contemporary society have reached very sophisticated accommodations before, in the Fourth Century, and in the Thirteenth Century, for instance. It believe it will happen again. The Gospel is too eloquent and fits the human condition too beautifully for it not to happen.



Out of Solitude

BeFrienders are lay volunteers who provide pastoral care. They are trained to offer a caring, nonjudgmental presence and actively listen to the emotional and spiritual needs of people. They are a living reminder of God's love.

Foundation principles of BeFriender Ministry

God is present. BeFrienders are aware that they are in God's presence when befriending someone and that the time shared is a blessing to both the person befriended and the BeFriender.

Caring, not curing. BeFrienders serve as a living reminder of God's love. They are companions on the journey as others recognize, value and use their own God-given, Spirit-led wisdom.

Nonjudgmental presence. BeFrienders understand the importance of hearing another's story from that person's perspective. Openness and respect allow them to respond with empathy and without judgment.

Active listening. There is a healing power in being able to tell one's story. BeFrienders know the value of active listening skills, which are a critical component of training

RESPECT LIFE

ROBB SCHOOL SHOOTING

As a Catholic community of faith, we mourn the terrible loss of life that occurred in the massacre of schoolchildren at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas, on May 24, killing 21 people. Fear and anger fill many of our hearts—but that need not be our only responses. Action rooted in prayer and grounded in love can be our response as well.

Pope Francis invites us to work hard to avoid such tragedies as he spoke at the end of his general audience in St. Peter's Square on May 25. He said:

"My heart is broken for the massacre at the elementary school in Texas. I am praying for the children and the adults killed and their families. It is time to say enough to the indiscriminate trafficking of weapons. Let us all work hard so that such tragedies can never happen again."

In the past, the American Bishops have written that the Church has been a consistent voice for the promotion of peace, and a strong advocate for the reasonable regulation of firearms. For many years, the USCCB has supported a number of reasonable measures to address the problem of gun violence. These include:

- A total ban on assault weapons, which the USCCB supported when the ban passed in 1994 and when Congress failed to renew it in 2004;
- Measures that control the sale and use of firearms, such as universal background checks for all gun purchases;
- Limitations on civilian access to high-capacity weapons and ammunition magazines, including banning all “bump stocks”;
- A federal law to criminalize gun trafficking;
- Improved access to and increased resources for mental health care and earlier interventions;
- Regulations and limitations on the purchasing of handguns including setting a more appropriate minimum age for gun ownership;
- Measures that make guns safer, such as locks that prevent children and anyone other than the owner from using the gun without permission and supervision;
- An honest assessment of the toll of violent images and experiences which inundate people, particularly our youth.
- Urging Catholics and all people of good will to contact Senators and Representatives to support legislative measures that uphold safety of all persons in our communities.


