PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

Every year, Spotify offers a fun feature called "Wrapped," revealing a listener's music stats for the year. For 2025, here are some of my primary stats:

I listened to 34,066 minutes of music in 2025. I listened to 217 albums completely through. I listened to 5247 different songs by 1121 artists from 365 different genres. My top 5 genres were Indie Rock, New Wave, Power Pop, Art Pop and Singer-Songwriter. My most-listened-to song was "My Golden Years" by The Lemon Twigs. It's perfect power pop and leads off an album full of great songs, *A Dream is All We Know*. That was also my most-listened-to album. My top artist was a Scottish musician named C. Duncan. I did listen to some music made in 2025 (Panda Bear, BC Camplight, Matt Berninger) but clearly erred on the side of music made before this year. I've found some great "Best of 2025" lists on YouTube that I will be digging through in the coming months. There is so much music to discover and enjoy!

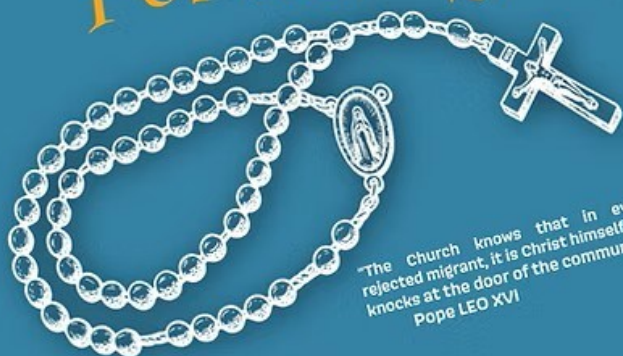
