

### A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BRAD



June 17, 2023

Dear People of Visitation Parish,

Two years ago, the parish Racial Justice Committee and Visitation School fastened upon the goal of bringing Cristo Rey High School students to work as student interns at our elementary school. Money was raised for four Cristo Rey students to work with our own children, at our own school, most every day of the school week. For the past two years, the goal has been realized and the labor commenced. Everyone I hear from tells me that it has been a very good experience for our Visitation School children and the Cristo Rey kids too.

We want to do this again in 2023-24 and to fund our Cristo Rey interns for another year requires about \$29,500. I ask you to consider a donation to this worthy cause to help us meet our goal.

So what makes it "worthy"? Just this: Our own children's education should extend to important areas beyond reading, writing, and arithmetic. In a Catholic school there must, by definition, also be education in the human condition. Human formation goes hand in hand with religious catechesis. Indeed, one hardly makes a bit of sense without the other.

Cristo Rey sends us young people from other parts of town, often of races and ethnicities different from our own, who are interested in making teaching their career. The example of these Cristo Rey High School students, and the exposure of our kids to them, and their exposure to our kids, can do much to cultivate mutual understanding and respect, even beyond whatever is taught in the way of academic subjects. This has been the rationale of our Racial Justice Committee and our School community and it has been working. If you believe in it, please support this effort with a contribution.



#### **FINANCIAL**

May Contribution Income was short of budget by 12.38% or \$29,458. This shortfall continues the trend from last year. This month's deficit in contributions has increase the year-to-date shortfall to \$72,327 or 1.8 % of budget. The good news is that Other Income, which includes ministries, program fees, miscellaneous one-time donations, school tuition, registration fees and before/after care fees exceeded budget by \$13,497.

Parish expenses were over budget this month by \$25,876 primarily due to higher than anticipated facilities expenses. This negative variance, in both Operating Income and Operating Expenses, leaves the Parish Net Income under budget by \$19.53% or \$41,837 for the month.



shortfall in contribution income increased the negative variance to \$72,327 or 1.8%. On the other hand "Other Income" exceeded budget by almost the same amount of \$71,194 wiping most of the income deficit of parish income to only \$1,133 under budget. Parish Operating Expenses for the year-to-date, exceeded budget by \$41,533 or 0.89%, driven primarily by higher than anticipated utilities and a variety of unbudgeted facility and maintenance expenditures in both church and school. Adding these expense overages to shortfall in contribution produced a negative variance in Parish Net Income of \$42,533 or 19.53% for the year-to-date. Please note that Extraordinary Income, which includes capital improvement fund donations, memorials, wills and bequests not reflected in our normal operating results, has generated a surplus of over \$329,596 so far this year which will offset the negative variance in Net Operating Income for the fiscal year.
