

# SOCIAL CONCERNS

### **CLEMENCY FOR MICHAEL TISIUS**

The state of Missouri is scheduled to execute Michael Tisius on June 6, 2023 at 6:00 pm. This will be the third execution this year in Missouri, and another is scheduled in August. Visitation parishioner Elizabeth Carlyle is one of the attorneys representing Michael and asks for the parish's prayers and help.

When Michael was 19 years old in June of 2000, he participated in a failed attempt to help an older prisoner,



Roy Vance, escape from the Randolph County, Missouri Jail in Huntsville, Missouri. In the attempt, Michael Tisius killed the two jail guards, Leon Egley and Jason Acton. He was arrested soon afterwards and confessed to his crime.

Michael was especially vulnerable to Vance because of his age, mental impairments and terribly traumatic childhood. He saw Vance as the father he never had. Vance has now taken full responsibility for the plan and for involving Michael. Vance is serving a sentence of life without parole, but Michael was sentenced to death. Much of the information about Michael's

background that has now been developed was not presented to the jury which sentenced him to death. His lawyers were paid an inadequate flat fee for his sentencing hearing, and the Missouri Public Defender System got what it paid for.

Since he came to prison in 2000, Michael has matured. Now 42 years old, he is not the adolescent who came to prison. His former warden, Troy Steele, has described him as "a model inmate" who "expressed regret and remorse. And I would say this was very unusual." Michael is a talented artist. He lives peacefully in the prison



and has a positive impact on others. He is not the person he was in 2000.

Our Catholic Catechism provides, "The Church teaches, in the light of the Gospel, that 'the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person' and she works with determination for its abolition worldwide."

There is no question that Michael's crime was a terrible one. But Mr. Egley and Mr. Acton cannot be restored to life by Michael's execution. And there is very little evidence that execution helps the surviving victims, precisely for that reason.

For all of these reasons, we urge you to work against this execution. You can do that by -

- Prayer, for Michael, for his victims, for his legal team, and for those who must carry out the execution
- Contacting Governor Parson, who has the power to grant clemency and commute Michael's sentence to life without parole. The best way to do this now is to use the phone number and email contact form on the governor's website, governor.mo.gov.
- Spreading the word!

# If the execution proceeds as now scheduled, please plan to attend the vigil here at Visitation on June 6 at 5:45 pm in the St. Joseph Chapel.


nursery, with school of religion or Vacation Bible School - this list goes on. Please see below:

## FINANCIAL

April Contribution Income was short of budget by \$19,832 or 6.69%. This month's deficit in contributions has increased the year-to-date shortfall to \$42,869 or 1% of budget. The good news is that Other Income, which includes ministries, program fees, miscellaneous one-time donations, school tuition, registration fees and before/after care fees exceeded budget by \$16,642.

Parish expenses, were under budget this month by \$16,868 due to lower than anticipated facilities and operational expenses. This cost savings reduced the negative variance in Operating Income, leaving the Parish Net Income over budget by \$13,678 for the month.

This month's deficit in contribution income increased the negative variance in year-to-date contribution income to \$42,869 or 1.1%, while Other Income exceeded

budget for the year-to-date by \$57,696. This shortfall in contributions reduced our positive year-to-date income from \$18,009 to \$16,868 ahead of budget. Parish Operating Expenses for the year-to-date, however, exceeded budget by 15,657, or 0.4%, driven primarily by higher than anticipated utilities and a variety of unbudgeted facility and maintenance expenditures in both the Church and School. Adding these expense overages to the contribution excess produced a negative variance in Parish Net Income of only \$830 or 0.2% for the year-to-date. Please note that Extraordinary Income, which includes capital improvement fund donations, memorials, wills and bequests are not reflected in our normal operating results and have generated a surplus of over \$304,592 so far this year which will offset the negative variance in Net Operating Income for the fiscal year. Compared to last fiscal year Parish Income shows a surplus of \$14,124, while operating expenses are higher by \$21,749 - creating a negative difference of \$7,625.
