



SOCIAL CONCERNS

CLEMENCY FOR MICHAEL TISIUS

The state of Missouri is scheduled to execute Michael Tisius on June 6, 2023 at 6:00 pm. This will be the third execution this year in Missouri, and another is scheduled in August. Visitation parishioner Elizabeth Carlyle is one of the attorneys representing Michael and asks for the parish's prayers and help.

When Michael was 19 years old in June of 2000, he participated in a failed attempt to help an older prisoner,



Roy Vance, escape from the Randolph County, Missouri Jail in Huntsville, Missouri. In the attempt, Michael Tisius killed the two jail guards, Leon Egley and Jason Acton. He was arrested soon afterwards and confessed to his crime.

Michael was especially vulnerable to Vance because of his age, mental impairments and terribly traumatic childhood. He saw Vance as the father he never had. Vance has now taken full responsibility for the plan and for involving Michael. Vance is serving a sentence of life without parole, but Michael was sentenced to death. Much of the information about Michael's

background that has now been developed was not presented to the jury which sentenced him to death. His lawyers were paid an inadequate flat fee for his sentencing hearing, and the Missouri Public Defender System got what it paid for.

Since he came to prison in 2000, Michael has matured. Now 42 years old, he is not the adolescent who came to prison. His former warden, Troy Steele, has described him as "a model inmate" who "expressed regret and remorse. And I would say this was very unusual." Michael is a talented artist. He lives peacefully in the prison and has a positive impact on others. He is not the person he was in 2000.

Our Catholic Catechism provides, "The Church teaches, in the light of the Gospel, that 'the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person' and she works with determination for its abolition worldwide."

There is no question that Michael's crime was a terrible one. But Mr. Egley and Mr. Acton cannot be restored to life by Michael's execution. And there is very little evidence that execution helps the surviving victims, precisely for that reason.

For all of these reasons, we urge you to work against this execution. You can do that by -

- Prayer, for Michael, for his victims, for his legal team, and for those who must carry out the execution.
- Contacting Governor Parson, who has the power to grant clemency and commute Michael's sentence to life
 without parole. The best way to do this now is to use the phone number and email contact form on the
 governor's website, governor.mo.gov.
- Spreading the word!

If the execution proceeds as now scheduled, please plan to attend the vigil here at Visitation on June 6 at 5:45 pm in the St. Joseph Chapel.



RACIAL JUSTICE



VISITATION RACIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE

One of the stated missions of the Vis Racial Justice committee is to "Look at our own biases, reflect on and develop our own Christian rooted response to racism." In addition we seek to "offer or promote opportunities to continue our education on the topic of racial diversity." To that end—we share this invitation:

Local nonprofit <u>American Public Square</u> is hosting an important event on Wednesday, June 7 at University Academy on the topic of "<u>Reparations in KC</u>." Here's how the program is being described:

Kansas City is on the clock... In January, the Kansas City Council approved a new commission tasked with looking into slavery reparations for Black residents. The panel has been given 12 months to produce recommendations on how the city can "make amends for its participation in the sanctioning of the enslavement of Black people and historical enforcement of segregation." This question is part of a much larger debate: What does society owe the descendants of enslaved people? How can we measure the harms caused by slavery? Who decides what ought to be done to repair those harms, and who should pay? And amid increased polarization, will slavery reparations only aggravate racial tensions in Kansas City? Join American Public Square and KCPBS on Wednesday, June 7 to listen to a panel of experts deliberate these very questions.

Panelists include: former Evanston, Illinois Councilwoman, Robin Rue Simmons, who led that town's effort to pass legislation to approve reparations; Councilwoman Melissa Robinson from Kansas City, Missouri, District 3, who championed the ordinance to form the Kansas City commission which will recommend a plan on reparations; Mr. Mickey Dean, a member of the KC Reparations Coalition; and Mr. Ron Christie, an American Government relations expert and Republican political strategist. The moderated panel will be led by Nick Haines of Kansas City PBS.

Doors open at 5:30pm; the formal program will run from 6:00-7:30pm. Kansas City PBS will record and rebroadcast the event. Click here for more details and to register for this free event.

Congratulations on your Engagement! Visitation welcomes you into the marriage preparation process that will enrich and equip you to experience a joy-filled marriage. Visitation's engaged couples who are preparing for marriage are guided in an insightful and life-giving marriage preparation process. Our process helps form essential marriage tools and establish a closer connection with our parish community. The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph sets the expectation that engaged couples will notify parishes at least nine months in advance of their weddings in order to participate fully in preparation for



the sacrament of marriage. Over the years our parish community has learned this and, without exception, contacts the parish as soon as they are engaged. For the most part people have to do that in order to get the church and reception site dates lined up well in advance of nine months. More recently, couples who are going "home" (out of Kansas City) to be married have contacted the parish three – six months before their weddings which does not allow adequate time. To be fair to those couples themselves and to the 40+ couples currently in marriage preparation at Visitation, if you are newly engaged, please contact our pastoral associate, Chris Sanders at 753-5155 x1309 or church.visitation.org so we can begin your new journey to married life.
