Being asked to write this February reflection on love felt like a God Wink/God Moment, because the ask came on the very same day that I finished reading Bob Goff's book about God's love entitled Everybody Always. I readily agreed because I was feeling God's love for all and was feeling open to share the love of Christ within me. And yet, at first blush, I thought to focus on Valentine's Day, the celebration of romantic love and of love shared by friends and family. I thought perhaps learning about St. Valentine would lead me to find insights to share with you. Although Christ's Divine Love was the reason I agreed to write this, and the obvious topic to address, I shied away from doing so.

Alas, thoughts of Ash Wednesday (February 26) herded me back to what my shepherd Jesus had intended for me to focus on all along as Ash Wednesday led me to think of Lenten preparation for Easter. Easter, our most sacred celebration of Christ's Divine Love for us. Father Norm Rotert preached, "We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song." As such, Alleluia; we are called to live this Divine Love in all ways always.

Divine Love, Agape Love, begins with God's redemptive love for us. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life," John 3:16. Agape Love continues with the commandments, "... You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul and will all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it. You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Matthew 22:37-39.

Scripture tells us that God's Divine Love, the love of and for God, self and other, is rooted in forgiveness and redemption. The Catholic Dictionary states it "is the most distinctively Christian form of love. Used by Christ to describe the love among the persons of the Trinity, it is also the love he commanded his followers to have for one another. It is totally selfless love, which seeks not one's own advantage but which seeks only to benefit another." Another definition explains, "Agape is selfless love - the love that seeks the good of the other. I love not for what it does for me but because of the care for the other." Without naming it as Agape Love, Bob Goff challenges us to "become love" by "loving everybody, always!"

We sing, "Love one another, for love is of God. Love one another for God is love." The circular nature and the unconditional nature of the ecosystem of God's Divine Love is a holy mystery at the core of our faith. We receive love and so we give love; we give love and so we receive love. This is real and evident and unfathomable all at the same time. The call of discipleship is a call to love divinely with full and active participation. We are invited to enter in full-on because that is how Jesus loved and God loves. God's Agape Love is prayerful action, just as Jesus did for us, we must do for others. This action might be prayer only or prayer plus. As Bob Goff says, "Love Does." Loving like this isn't always comfortable or convenient but always right and just.

Imagine doing it; imagine loving everybody, always. Imagine becoming love. Isn't that what lesus imagines? May you be blessed by the God of LOVE whose greatest desire is to be one with you. May you draw close and know the thrill of God's beating heart against your own. May this Lover God be a listening presence in every word and thought and experience of your existence.
